Understanding advising

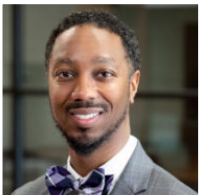
Exploring the advisor and advisee relationship

Advising is critical to graduate student success. But there is still ambiguity in the literature on higher education on the various advising experiences that students have. Insights from 42 qualitative interviews provide a new framework of care and wholeness for graduate advising, as well as insights into the many types of advising graduate students encounter.
